In our closing event, it was evident that the students were very pleased with what they had gotten out of the class, and that they had clearly developed some new vocabulary for talking about cultural difference and cultural interaction.

This program week also included a welcome luncheon attended by special visitors from the Walt Disney World International College Program. The Disney visitors were visibly impressed by the course the students were taking and even more so by the quality of the students from Meiji University selected to participate in the program this year.

One of the wonderful aspects of our FSU Special Academic Summer Programs is the relationship that develops between your students and our FSU Peer Mentors. We have carefully selected U.S. students who feel confident interacting with international students and who are particularly committed to sharpening their own cross-cultural skills as they seek to develop friendships with students from around the world.

As I sat in on some of our training, and cultural skills building sessions with the Peer Mentors, I was moved by the thoughtfulness the Peers give to doing their jobs well. During a pres-session on Japanese culture and Japanese student cultural adjustment issues, they asked some incredibly insightful questions. And, I think, they learned a lot.

This year, they have shown a genuine interest in delving a little deeper to share more about their own cultural backgrounds, and to learn more about your students backgrounds as well. Some of the discussions that the Peers reported having with the students suggest that the time they spend together really does contribute to mutual understanding between peoples of different cultures. In that way, both students and Peers support the stated mission of the U.S. State Department's J visa Exchange Visitor program and become skilled global citizens and wonderful ambassadors. The stated purpose of the Fulbright Hays Act, through which the J visa was created, is to enable the "U.S. to increase mutual understanding between the people of the U.S. and the people of other countries by means of ... cultural exchange."
