- (b) Applicants who underwent standard high school education or are undergoing standard university education conducted **entirely in English** are not required to submit an official score from one of the tests listed below.

## 6. Number of Students Admitted

School of Global Japanese Studies (English track)	If there are a particularly large number of applicants, there may be a limit placed on the number of students admitted. Universities that have two or more students applying to the School of Global Japanese Studies should assign an order of priority to their applicants.
Graduate School of Science and Technology, International Program in Architecture and Urban Design	Annual enrollment capacity is 28 students per year. If the enrollment capacity for a particular year has already been reached, exchange students will not be accepted to this program for the 2026 academic year. Universities that have two or more students applying to the Graduate School of Science and Technology, International Program in Architecture and Urban Design should assign an order of priority to their applicants.
Graduate School of Governance Studies (English Track)	Annual enrollment capacity is 8 students. If 8 students are admitted in April 2026 and they all want to study in Japan for a full year, no additional students will be accepted to this program for enrollment in September 2026.

Graduate School of Science and Technology, International Program in Architecture and Urban Design	Must have a bachelor's degree related to architecture and must currently be enrolled in a program related to architecture.
Graduate School of Global Business	If you have taken GMAT, please submit an official score as a reference. (Optional) We offer 5 compulsory subjects and 60 elective subjects conducted in English, and the details of classes are to be referred to the <u>Fact Sheet</u> .

- 1. The classes conducted in the 2026AY have yet to be fixed at the time of the application since they will be finalized in late March 2026. The available classes for exchange students will be informed during the orientation week after their arrival. - 2. If an applicant requires special assistance when studying at Meiji University, please make sure to inquire with the International Student Office **before your application**. Meiji University will consider whether assistance is available. We may request additional documents if ever needed. Any inquiry/request about special assistance after your application, or in cases when we could not receive the necessary documents on time, we will not be able to give special assistance.
