Meiji University Activity Restriction Guidelines

Under the Meiji University Activity Restriction Guidelines, the spread of the new-type coronavirus infection is divided into 6 stages from level 0 to 5, and defines the scope of each activity according to each level. (Released on April 22, 2020) The Guidelines and actions are subject to change depending on future conditions. We will notify you of any new information through HP, Oh-o! Meiji etc.

• The current Level is 0(Blue). The period from April 1, 2023 to May 7, 2023 is the transition period from Level 1 to Level 0.
