Presidential Address

Next April, Meiji University will launch a new Minor Program open to all undergraduate students. This program offers a structured opportunity to pursue a secondary field of study alongside your major. A student in the School of Global Japanese Studies, for example, might study law; a student in the School of Agriculture could explore international relations; and a student in the School of Arts and Letters may choose to delve into business strategy. This multifaceted approach to learning will equip you to tackle complex social issues from multiple perspectives.

Encountering and understanding these new perspectives will enable you to internalize diversity and develop the ability to confront today's challenges with flexibility and depth. This is learning that truly embodies the spirit of "Rights and Liberty, Independence and Self-Government." The Minor Program will be a valuable opportunity to expand your intellectual curiosity and unlock new possibilities for yourself. I hope you will grasp this exciting opportunity.

Meiji University will support you on your journey through both scientific inquiry and diverse human connections. Your years on campus will not only be a time to acquire knowledge, but also to refine your values, develop your character, and shape the future together with your peers.

One hundred and forty-four years ago, the three young founders of Meiji University, still in

their twenties, created this institution with a firm resolve to break through the barriers of their time. The baton of their passion has been passed down through the generations, and now, it has been entrusted to every one of you.

Cherish each day of your university life. Do not fear challenges. Seek out new knowledge, new people, and new worlds. As members of Meiji University, carve out your own future, and at the same time, gain the strength to help shape the future of Japan and the world.
