2. To take only courses conducted in English (including Japanese Language Courses)

(1) Enrolled as a sophomore, junior, senior student at one of School of Arts and Letters' partner institutions.

(2) Satisfy English language proficiency requirement:

- TOEFL iBT 3.5, IELTS 4.5, TOEIC 600, CEFR B1 and above
- Applicants who underwent high school (secondary school) education or are undergoing university education conducted entirely in English are not required to submit English test score.

* If you would like to enroll subject courses offered in Japanese after starting your study at Meiji, you need to submit a proof of Japanese language proficiency such as JLPT and transcripts from Meiji's Japanese language courses.

Please send all the application documents by mail.

- A) Application Form (designated form)
- B) Housing Request (designated form)
- C) Certificate of Health (designated form, must be completed by a doctor)
- D) Health Report (designated form)
- E) Statement of Financial Support (designated form)
- F) Document proving the amount of funds indicated on the Statement of Financial Support.
(e.g., a balance certificate for the applicant, a copy of the applicant's bank book, an income certificate of the sponsor, bank balance certificate, or copy of the bankbook for the bank account of the sponsor, certificate of receiving scholarship, etc.)
- G) Recommendation Letter (from the dean of your home department to the dean of the School of Arts and Letters)
- H) Official, original academic transcript (hard copy)
- I) A copy of the identification page of your passport
- J) ID photo data (4cm height × 3cm width)

- K) Study Plan (designated form, 1,000-2,000 words in Japanese)
- L) To enroll in subject courses offered in Japanese (except Japanese Language Courses):
A photocopy of your Japanese Language Proficiency Test Certificate or Japanese Language Proficiency Certificate (designated form)
- M) To enroll in subject courses offered in English:
A copy of English Language Proficiency Test Certificate (if applicable)

6. Notes

There may be some regulations regarding class registration based on students' Japanese language proficiency level.

Applicants may not be accepted into their first-choice program.

Official transcripts will be issued in the end of September for the Spring semester and in the end of April for the Fall semester.
