Students will acquire the ability to disseminate knowledge through their studies on traditional Japanese cultural practices, contemporary Japanese culture, and Japanese social systems. SGJS students study for 4 years in Nakano, where vibrant subcultures of Japan exist, allowing students to experience elements of "Cool Japan."

CAREER SUPPORT

In Japan, university students start job hunting at the beginning of their fourth year. At the Employment and Career Development Support Room, students can receive career support from qualified consultants.

The services include:

- •One-on-one career counseling
- Resume review
- Job interview tips and practice in English and Japanese
- Access to job-hunting reports written by former students
- Career seminars for international students

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Meiji University offers various financial aid for international students. Scholarships offered by Meiji are classified into 2 categories: scholarships determined before admission and scholarships determined after admission. Students can also apply for scholarships offered by the Japanese government and private foundations. In addition to the scholarships, Meiji offers a tuition assistance program that all newly admitted international students can apply for.

Growing up in the US as a half-Japanese, I always wanted to experience living and studying in Japan, but I knew it would be difficult because of my limited Japanese language education. So I researched universities in Tokyo with English degree programs, and the SGJS English Track program matched my education goals. I also felt the program would offer me the chance to explore and study things I am interested in with more depth.

Currently, I am focused on taking courses related to politics and social systems to educate myself about international relations. In my third and fourth years, I would like to add Chinese and Korean language classes to my curriculum to pursue my career as an interpreter.

After graduation, I am looking into getting a Master's degree in Korea to continue my Korean language education. Once I finish school, I would like to become an interpreter in the arts and entertainment industry or the fashion industry.

Although this program has fewer students than other faculties of Meiji, it helps open your eyes to see how the world works outside of Japan. The program gives you so much freedom to follow your interests within the global community, and this broadens your career options both inside and outside of the country. I decided to study in Japan because when I visited Japan as part of a cultural exchange program in high school, I fell in love with the country. Also, Meiji University offered me a scholarship which has financially supported my university education. I chose the SGJS English Track program since it allowed me to get an undergraduate degree in English.

At SGJS, I took a range of subjects including linguistics, economics, manga and animation studies, Japanese representational arts, hospitality and tourism management, etc. I specifically focused on linguistics and took a seminar course related to discourse analysis.

Throughout 4 years, I enjoyed my student experience at Meiji. SGJS has a student committee that organizes cultural-exchange events for both Japanese and international students, so I had many opportunities to communicate with Japanese friends. Studying at Nakano was also fun since there are a lot of shops and restaurants where I could hang out with friends.

As I am a new graduate, I plan to look for work in the United States. I hope to utilize the liberal arts knowledge and skills gained from my university education.
