-Inflation and accounting: lessons learned from the German hyperinflation in 1923-

Exactly 100 years ago, Germany experienced the most devastating inflation in modern history. Recently, this topic has resurfaced as a global phenomenon with substantial public attention, even in Japan, a country that did not see inflation for more than three decades.

Acknowledging the historically close ties in accounting thought between Germany and Japan, this lecture explores the origins and socio-economic effects of the German hyperinflation in 1923. It details the experiences German firms made with their accounting information systems 100 years ago. Based thereon, it will be illustrated which challenges a (hyper-)inflationary situation presents for the operation of contemporary accounting and reporting systems.

Sebastian Hoffmann is a Research Professor of Accounting at HHL Leipzig Graduate School of Management (Germany), and a Visiting Professor at the University of Economic Studies (ASE) Bucharest (Romania).
