But this experience of College life is about so much more; it's about being part of a friendly and vibrant community with access to great facilities.

While living in either Pembroke or King's accommodation you'll have access to the College libraries and sports grounds as well as a wide range of College services such as the College Nurse. You'll soon come to realise that a College is not just a dorm, but a uniquely supportive environment.

Academic Study

Our programme is renowned for its rigorous and intellectually challenging courses and at the centre of our ethos is small-group teaching. To achieve the interactive educational culture we believe is so important on PKP, we usually cap each lecture group at thirty students and each seminar group at fifteen.

We encourage you to develop your academic curiosity and really benefit from the unique learning environment at Cambridge. So, while you might take one or two PKP courses for credit at your home institution, we invite you to try something new and our three-course structure lets you do just that.

With around 45 courses on offer across a range of disciplines you really are spoilt for choice and if you're interested in developing your independent research skills, why not replace one of your courses with a supervision project? You'll immerse yourself in a project of your choice under the one-to-one guidance of an academic expert. It's a great option if you're planning to write a senior thesis or pursue graduate studies.

Outside the Classroom

While studying is an important aspect of PKP, this is your chance to truly experience Cambridge student life.

Our team of Programme Assistants (PAs) will organise an exciting and varied schedule of activities for you to try. As Cambridge students themselves, they're well placed to help you navigate the city and take advantage of the city's wonderful cultural offerings.

They'll introduce you to Cambridge classics such as croquet, cream teas, punting on the River Cam and a whole host of other activities. So, whether you're into sports, museums, sightseeing, performing, you name it – we'll have an activity planned to suit you.

How to Apply

Are you ready to start your PKP journey?

We welcome applications from intellectually ambitious students from all over the world.

Competition for places on PKP is intense and we consider applications on a rolling basis, so make sure you apply early.

You apply to PKP through an online platform, but will also need to make sure your home institution sends us a transcript and academic reference. You'll need a minimum GPA of 3.2 or equivalent and will have finished the first year of your degree course by the start of PKP. It's also important you have a high level of fluency in English and we'll ask to see evidence of this if needed.

Once we've received your completed application we'll let you know our decision within ten working days.




The Pembroke College Circle
