

Application Guidelines for Tuition Assistance (Reduction) Program for Privately Financed International Students AY 2024

1. Eligibility (Applicants must meet all of the requirements below.)

Requirements	<p>(1) Students with high motivation, outstanding academic results but who have difficulties in attending school for financial reasons</p> <p>(2) Privately financed international students enrolled in a regular course at Meiji University (excluding exchange students)</p> <p>(3) Students who hold a valid “student” residence status as of April 26, 2024 (Friday)</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">※ If you do not have a valid “student” residence status as of Friday, April 26, 2024, you must meet one of the following requirements</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">A) Students who have applied for COE at the International Student Office by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 26, 2024.</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">B) Students who have applied for the procedures to obtain “student” resident status by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 26, 2024. (Extension of Period of Stay, Change of Resident Status).</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">※ Students who do not have “student” residence status due to participation in study abroad programs admitted by Meiji University are eligible.</p> <p>(4) <u>Students who attain scores for their latest cumulative GPA as set out below:</u> <u>Undergraduates: 2.00 or above / Graduates: 3.00 or above</u> <u>For the Graduate School of Professional Accountancy only: 1.70 or above</u></p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">※ Not required for newly admitted students</p> <p>(5) For undergraduates who have earned more than 20 credits in AY2023</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">※ <u>No credit requirement applies for newly admitted undergraduate/graduate students.</u></p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">※ For those enrolled in fall semester of AY 2023, credits earned in AY2023 must be 10 or more.</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">※ For those re-enrolled in the AY 2024, credits earned in the previous academic year in which the student was enrolled must be 20 or more. If the enrolled period for the previous academic year was 1 semester, credits earned must be 10 or more.</p> <p>(6) Students who fall under the relevant conditions below at the time of April 26, 2024</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">A) <u>If the applicant is in Japan and their financial supporter is living outside Japan</u>, the amount of allowance sent from the financial supporter needs to be less than JPY 90,000 per month on average. (Excluding admission and tuition fees)</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">B) <u>If the applicant and their financial supporter are both living in Japan</u>, the annual income of the supporter needs to be less than JPY 5,000,000.</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">C) <u>If the applicant and their financial supporter are both living outside Japan</u>, the annual income of the supporter needs to be less than JPY 7,000,000.</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">※ The standard amounts for B) and C) are based on the assumption that there are four people in the household. If there are more than five people in the household, please refer to the table below. Please note that inquiries will not be accepted after 17:00 on Friday, April 26, so please be sure to complete your inquiries well before then. ※ If you are not able to apply online due to network issues, etc. please consult with the International Student Office by e-mail by 13:00 on Friday, April 26. ● Online application can be submitted only once. Documents to be Submitted	<p>The following documents need to be submitted during online application. Please prepare in advance.</p> <p>If you have any documents that you cannot submit due to special circumstances, <u>please consult with the International Student Office in advance by e-mail (iso@mics.meiji.ac.jp)</u> and submit the document as instructed.</p> <p>(1) Documents proving your status of residence as a "Student". Please submit the following documents ① or ②.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ① Students who have valid "student" residence status as of April 26, 2024 (Friday), need to submit a photocopy or scanned data of both sides of their residence card on the online application form. ② Students who do not have valid "student" residence status as of April 26, 2024 (Friday), need to enter the reason why you do not have a residence card with the status of "Student" on the application form". <p>(2) Photocopy or scanned data of a certificate of income that states your financial supporter's annual income for FY 2023.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ※ Submission is required when the applicant and the financial supporter both reside in the same country (including Japan). ※ If the certificate is not written in Japanese or English, please add a Japanese translation prepared by the applicant and submit it. ※ Not required if the applicant is in Japan and their financial supporter is living outside Japan. <p>(3) Study/Research Plan ※Only for graduate school students on masters or doctoral courses [designated format] → Download the Study/Research Plan format from our website, fill in the form, and upload it on the application form. (Please prepare it in advance.)</p> <p>(4) Request for Bank Transfer [designated format]</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ※ Please attach photocopies of both the cover page and the first facing pages. (E-bankbook is also allowed) ※ Please note that bank accounts cannot be changed, in principle. ※ Only bankbooks for bank accounts in Japan are acceptable. ※ If you do not have a bank account in Japan, we will ask you to provide the above information after your scholarship is confirmed. (After the recipients are determined, those who did not submit their bankbooks at the time of application will be contacted.) <p>【Notes】</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ※ When international students open a bank account, their account status is set as "Non-resident" if they have been in Japan for a short period of time. Outline and Purpose	To reduce the financial burden of privately financed international students in order to help them continue their studies by reducing tuition fees.

	Those who take a leave of absence in fall semester, AY2024	Students who attend the spring semester in AY2024 but are taking a leave of absence in the fall semester need to submit an application for a leave of absence to the school office and pay the fees by November 20. After completing this process, the amount of tuition assistance for the spring semester will be transferred to the submitted bank account. ※ DO NOT close the bank account until the money gets transferred to the bank account.																				

	Those graduating in September 2024	After graduation is confirmed in early-September, the amount of tuition assistance will be transferred to the submitted bank account by mid-September. ※ DO NOT close the bank account until the money gets transferred to the bank account.
Cancellation of Assistance Program	Tuition Assistance (Reduction) is canceled for any of the following reasons and when cancelled, the university may request a refund; (1) When the recipient's student resident status changes to another status from "Student" (2) When false declarations are found (3) When the recipient is expelled from school or receives punishment from the university (4) When the recipient has a poor attendance record and low academic results, which may negatively affect his/her degree completion (5) When the recipient is deemed to be an inappropriate recipient for Tuition Assistance (Reduction) Program for any other reason	

4. Screening

Screening Process	Recipients will be decided on the basis of their scholastic performance within their school. ※ Due to budgetary constraints, note that not all qualified applicants will be able to receive assistance.
Announcement of Results	Notification will be sent to all applicants via Oh-o!Meiji in late July (tentative).

5. Handling of Personal Information

Meiji University will use the submitted personal information only for the purpose of scholarship related matters, including screening, the decision-making process, and related office work. This is in compliance with the Meiji University Educational Foundation Personal Information Protection Policy and the Personal Information Protection Law and Regulations. Any personal information will be provided to a third party in compliance with laws and regulations, and never be used for other purposes.

6. Notes

Notes	(1) Any applicants who are found to be ineligible after completing the application procedure will be disqualified from the screening. (2) <u>Meiji University will contact students via the Oh-o! Meiji system. Please make sure to check it frequently.</u> (3) No reselection will be made under any circumstances.
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
