
Important Notes for Scholarship Transfer Account for International Students

When transferring money to a foreign student, we need to take appropriate transfer procedures based on " Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Law ".

When applying for the Meiji University Tuition Assistance (Reduction) Program for Privately Financed International Students, be sure to check these important notes before submitting your bank account information and follow the necessary procedures at the bank counter.

•Confirm with the bank where you created your account that your account is either "resident" or "non-resident".



① It was able to confirm that your bank account in Japan is a "resident".

->If there is a "non-resident" stamp on your passbook, make sure to erases it by bank person.

In the case of the eco bankbook, please describe that you are a resident when you apply for the scholarship.

(2) The bankbook of your bank account in Japan was confirmed as "non-resident".

->If you have lived in Japan for more than 6 months, you may be able to change your bank account status to "Resident.".

Please check at the bank counter and if possible, change your status to "Resident".

At that time, you must make sure the "non-resident" stamp on your passbook was erased by bank.

->If you are still set "Non-resident", please check if there is a "Non-resident" stamp on your bankbook. If you don't have a stamp, please get it stamped at the bank counter. In the case of an eco passbook, please indicate that you have confirmed your status as a "non-resident" when applying for the scholarship.

Be sure to check your account information at the bank before you apply.

In addition, if there is a change from "non-resident" to "resident" after the application,
