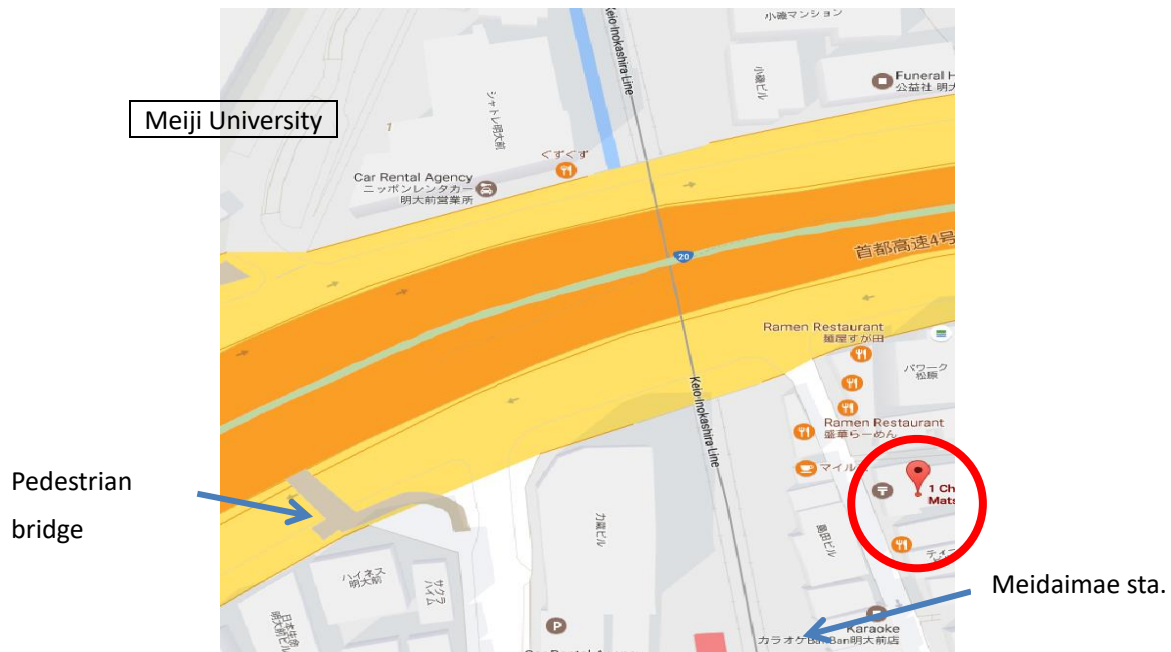


② Izumi Campus

2) Items to bring

- a) Residence Card
- b) Passport
- c) Inkan (personal seal)
 - * Those who do not have any inkan can put their signature on the application documents instead.
- d) Contact information (mobile phone number or IP telephone number of the residence)

3) Time required

An account will be ready on the day of your application. A cash card will be issued and sent to you by mail later.

*Some of the branches may take about a week for your passbook to be ready.
