Tony Bovaird is professor of Public Management and Policy at the University of Birmingham, and works on the Third Sector Research Center's Service Delivery Stream. He is a member of the Institute of Local Government Studies (INLOGOV) in the school of Government and Society within the University of Birmingham. He undertook evaluation case studies of the Civil Service Reform Programme, commissioned by the Cabinet Office and recently led the UK contribution to an EU project on user and community co-production of public services in five European countries.
