What is a seminar?

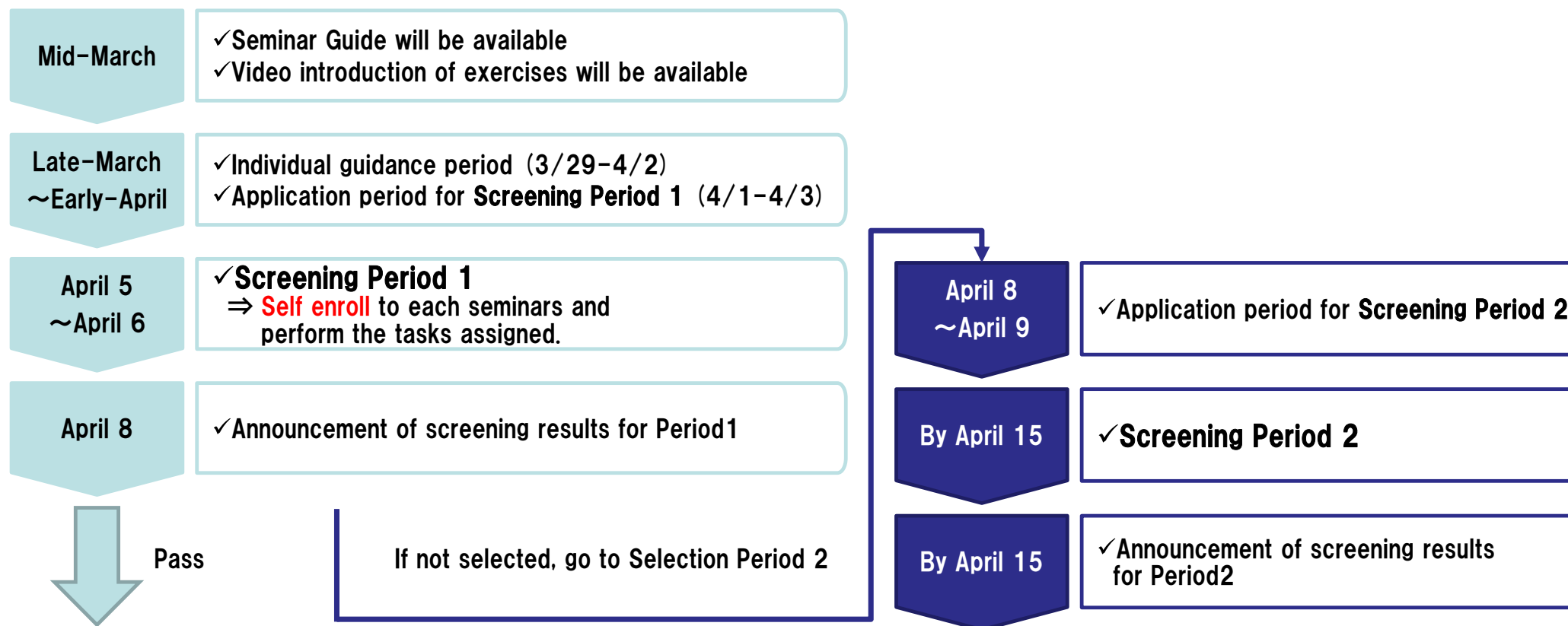
- ❑ A seminar offers students a core opportunity in university life to learn actively.

Students decide on their research themes, and engage in discussions and research activities.

- Elective course
- Capacity:
10 to 21 students per seminar

- ❑ Please note that not all exercises accept new sophomores.
Please be sure to check in advance whether or not the seminar accepts new sophomores, which is indicated in the list of seminars.

Application method

- ❑ Apply using the **Self Enrollment** function of Oh-o! Meiji
→After Self Enrolling, answer the questionnaire in each seminar's class web page.
- ❑ After registering, students will be required to complete the assignments provided by the instructor in charge of each seminar.
 - Examples of assignments: interviews, self-introduction reports, assignments, self-promotion videos, etc.

Notes

- Please be sure to check the seminar guide and the video before applying.
- **Only one application** will be accepted for **each of Exercise A/B and Exercise C/D** within the same application period. If applications for more than one seminar are confirmed, all applications will be considered invalid.
 - Example: You can apply for both Exercise A/B and Exercise C/D at the same time, since the alphabets are all different.

Changes in course opening patterns ①

Change of the target year of the seminar

- ❑ Some seminars will accept students in their second year. Please refer to the list of seminars to be released in March, regarding the acceptable academic year of each seminar.

Seminars which accept new Sophomores

→ Individual guidance in March of the
freshman year,
Selection of applicants in April of the
sophomore year

Seminars which accept new Juniors

→ Individual guidance in March of the
sophomore year,
Selection of applicants in April of the
junior year

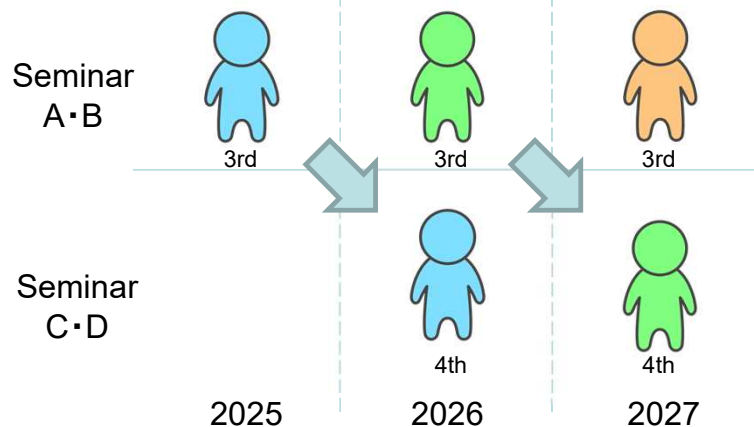


Changes in course opening patterns ②

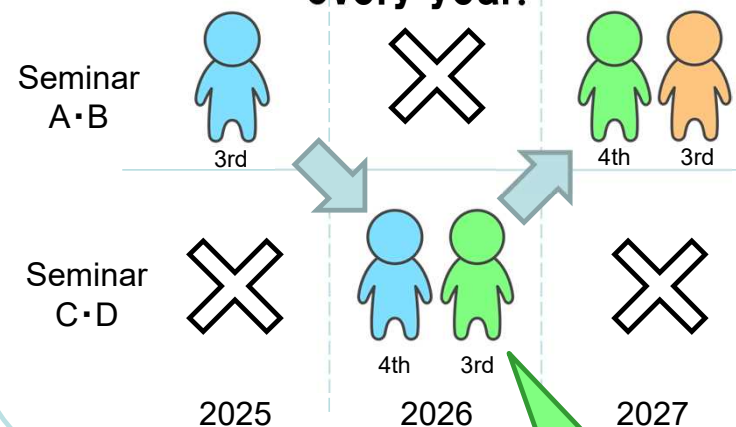
Change in the Format of Seminar Courses

- Some seminars are offered **every other year** or **completed in a single year**.
*Some students may start taking courses from “Seminar C”.

Seminar to be held in a carryover style
→ Seminar students lift up



Seminars held every other year
→ seminar students are replaced every year.

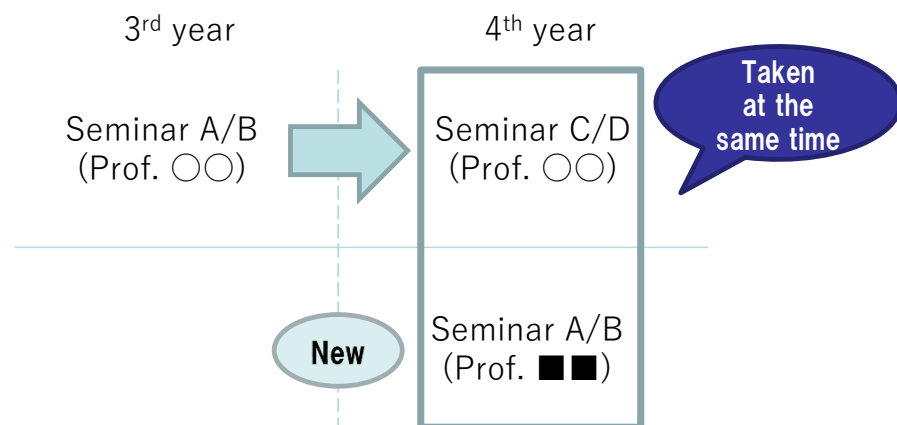


Changes in course opening patterns ③

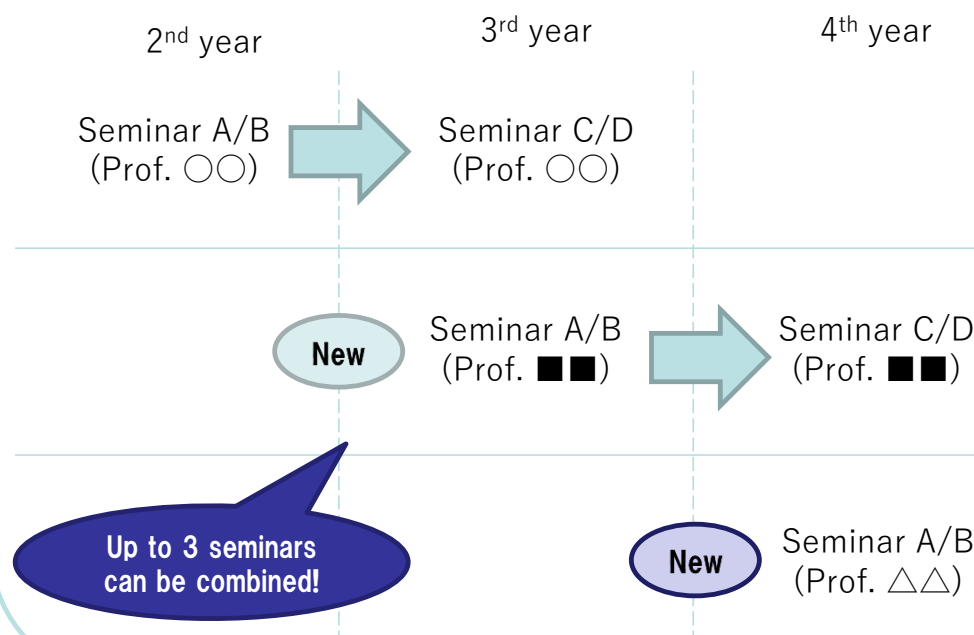
Students can take seminars offered by different teachers.

- Up to two seminars with different symbols can be taken per semester
→ Up to three seminars can be combined to create your own “Global Japanese Studies” program!

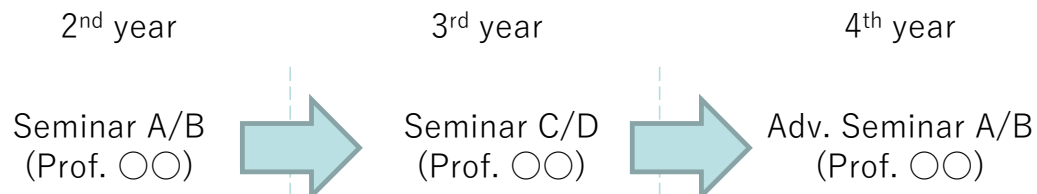


Changes in course opening patterns ④

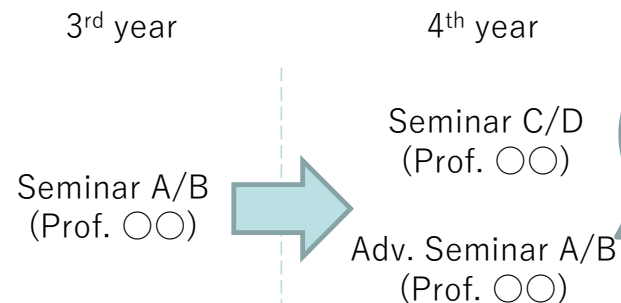
Students can study in the same seminar for up to three years

- Combination of seminars A-D and special seminars to deepen learning.

Depending on the pattern of seminar offerings, some courses may be taken at the same time as Seminars C and D.



Precautions for taking seminar courses

- ❑ **You cannot take two seminars with the same alphabet in the same semester.**
→ You cannot take two “Seminar A” in the same semester, etc.
- ❑ **Seminar A and B, or Seminar C and D must be taken as a set.**
*This does not apply to students who are not enrolled for a period of time due to study abroad or leave of absence.
- ❑ **Some teachers may have restrictions on the year of acceptance.**
→ For example, “Juniors and above”
- ❑ **Some teachers may require students to take the course for two consecutive years.**
→ For example, “If you take A and B, you must agree to take C and D the following year”, “To take C and D, you must earn credits for A and B”



Precautions for seminar screening

- ❑ **Applications must be completed by the deadline.**
 - After the deadline, applications for the same application period are **not accepted for any reason**.
- ❑ **If you apply to more than one seminar **with the same alphabet** during the same application period, all of them will be invalidated.**
 - Apply for 2 seminar A/B → All are invalid
 - Apply for 1 seminar A/B and 1 seminar C/D → Both are **valid**
 - Apply for 1 seminar A/B and 1 seminar A-D → All are invalid
- ❑ **Those who have been selected by the screening will not be eligible to participate in any subsequent selection under the same alphabet**
 - If you “Pass” a screening, you cannot apply to any further screenings with a same alphabet.



- ❑ I forgot to apply during 1st Application Period. What should I do?
→ **Please register for 2nd Screening.**
- ❑ Do all seminars have an opportunity for 2nd screening?
→ Some professors will not have a 2nd screening period if the class size reaches maximum capacity in the 1st Screening.
- ❑ If the seminar is held in English, does it count as an English Language elective course?
→ No, because seminars are not lecture courses.
