The course deals with global economic issues from a European perspective and highlights the role of the EU and its member countries in the world economy. Based on an introduction of relevant economic theories major developments and patterns in EU and world trade and investment, regional integration, trade policy, the monetary system and the recent financial crisis will be discussed.

On conclusion of this course students will understand global economic issues and will have the ability to investigate and critically analyse global economic problems. They will have gained a deepened understanding of the EU and its role in the world economy and have the ability to assess and evaluate actions and measures taken by – especially European – economic policy actors.
